

Caroline Meaby is Director, Arts Network at the British Council, the United Kingdom's international organisation for cultural relations and educational opportunities. At the British Council she is a member of the senior Arts leadership team in London and she oversees and coordinates the activity of the global network of over 300 specialist arts staff working across 110 countries. Her remit also involves overseeing the work of the Creative Europe Desk UK and the Arts External Relations team.

Caroline started her career as a television news journalist, then spent ten years as a producer at the BBC on a variety of factual and factual entertainment programmes. In 2009 she joined the BBC's inhouse training division to produce a number of training schemes, including a multimedia news production course for BAME broadcast journalists in the run up to the London 2012 Olympics.

In 2011 she left the BBC to take up the role of Talent Schemes Director at the Edinburgh International TV Festival. She was responsible for running the charitable activities of the Festival, fundraising and delivering a year-round calendar of masterclasses, industry insight talks and practical workshops.

In 2013, Caroline joined British Council Arts, as Senior Programme Manager in the Creative Economy team. Caroline forged major partnerships and designed global initiatives in creative enterprise, hubs and digital innovation. Caroline spent a year in Istanbul as Regional Arts Director, Wider Europe, before taking up her current position in summer 2018.
